NY HEAT Act is Neither Affordable Nor Reliable SB4158, Senator Krueger

The New York Home Energy Affordable Transition Act (NY HEAT) is a legislative proposal that the NY Senate has approved for the past two years. The New York State Legislature will once again consider passage of the NY HEAT Act which would have significant and detrimental impacts to energy consumers in regions across the state, particularly Western, Central and Northern New York.

Regions like Western New York have longer winter seasons than downstate, and routinely experience extremely cold temperatures and severe winter weather events. While individuals and businesses in Western New York rely on natural gas to safely heat their homes, downstate residents and businesses must rely on significantly higher emission sources for heating such as oil.

It also should be noted that according to the New York Independent System Operator (NYISO), 91% of Upstate NY's electricity, in Zones A-E, is already generated from renewable energy sources. Additionally, carbon dioxide emissions are down by nearly 50 percent over the past 25 years of competitive electricity markets in NY. This is in large part thanks to lower-emitting natural gas compared to other energy sources like coal and oil.

Decommissioning the natural gas system Upstate will not resolve the higher emission levels experienced in downstate New York and will only result in negative health, public safety and economic consequences for residents and businesses who require a reliable energy source for heating and operations.

Affordability

NY HEAT Act proposal to cap energy bills at 6% household income:

- Based on the claim that 1 in 4 families statewide would save up to \$136/month on average.
 - A modest estimate puts that unfunded subsidy of energy bills at roughly \$3 billion annually; the delta of subsidizing by the remaining more than half of NY households could result in a \$800 annual increase in energy bills.

Other impacts:

- No provisions as to who will incur costs to convert to all-electric which some estimate at approximately \$20k-50k for the average NY home.
- While the Act proposes to assist customers with costs related to electrification, the extent of that assistance is not clear and customers are likely to be responsible for at least some of these costs.
- The Act fails to identify new discrete funding sources to support the proposed customer assistance.

NY HEAT Act proposal to repeal the 100-ft. Rule:

- When a new home or business applies for gas service, the first 100-ft is "subsidized" which reduces the upfront
 costs to build new housing and new businesses.
 - Repeal would not result in an immediate 1 for 1 funding offset (i.e., for a 6% cap) as the "subsidy" is included in utility rate base and recovered over a 60–80-year period.
 - New customers bring additional revenue which helps to cover the utility's other fixed capital and operating
 costs and reduces what is needed from existing customers to cover those same costs, thus avoiding or
 delaying rate increases on all customers.

Local

- Lancaster moratorium- There is not any update on this. It is due to expire in April. Joe has reached out to Jeff Palumbo who was in contact with the Lancaster Town Attorney to see if there been any changes.

- o Orchard Park- There is a meeting being set up including Joe Benedict, Phil Nanula, Andy Romanowski, Jim Marrano, Ken Zollitsch, Bill Tuyn and David Capretto with the Orchard Park Town Supervisor Republican Nominee Joe Liberti in the middle of March.
- The Niagara County Builders Association is not as active as in the past, Phil is going to reach out to Kristen Savard and Gary Dimato to see if there is a contact to possibly merge their membership with ours.

State and National

- O Mike Fazio, NSBA is working on the sprinkler mandate. There is a study out, but has not yet been passed to the members.
- o ECWA-Would still like to meet regarding public water sources near private developments. Jen has reached out and Bill is going to reach out as well to try to set up meeting.

New Business

- Bill has been in touch with the Erie County Water Authority to change the codes on who is responsible for maintenance on public water sources that are installed near private roads. Bill will give an update once things have been decided or the next direction of the code
- o It was questioned if the Niagara Region Construction Alliance is aware and taking any action on this water issue. Joe is going to reach out to someone that was involved in the Association previously. As well as Phil who also has a connection with someone previously involved.
- A representative from Congressman Kennedy's office reached out to Joe Benedict in light of any possible lumbar tariffs that may come our way. They are at 14% and with the new administration may go up to 25%, but this is on the Federal level and may not effect the state level.

NAHB CEO Jim Tobin joins Wealth host Brad Smith to discuss finance and homebuilding.

According to the National Association of Homebuilders (NAHB), homebuilder confidence fell to a five-month low in February as political uncertainty continued to pressure the housing market. NAHB CEO Jim Tobin joins characterizes current housing market conditions as "stuck," citing the Trump administration's policies creating market uncertainty combined with "stubbornly high mortgage rates." He adds, "The existing market continues to be locked up, and I think builders are starting to wonder how soon we're going to see this recovery we've been hoping about." Tobin emphasizes that addressing the current housing affordability crisis requires increasing supply through new home and apartment construction. However, he identifies the current regulatory environment, immigration policy, and potential tariffs as significant headwinds to achieving this goal.

He warns that "tariffs and immigration policy are really starting to squeeze every market in this country."


